## W.U.S. Health Centre, University of Delhi Emergency Services Protocol Emergency No. 011-27666257

It has been observed that in cases of Medical Emergencies precious time is lost in seeking medical opinion and requisitioning of Ambulance from W.U.S. Health Centre to evacuate a patient to a nearby hospital.

It is therefore requested/reiterated that the patients suspected with following clinical conditions be evacuated to the nearest Hospital without any delay:

Disease/Clinical Condition	Symptoms / Signs
Myocardial Infarction (Heart Attack)	• The symptoms in men are intense chest pain, pain in the left arm or jaw and difficulty in breathing. Women may have some of the same symptoms, but the pain may be more diffuse and inconsistent spreading to the shoulders, neck, arms, abdomen and back or indigestion or unexplained anxiety, nausea, dizziness, palpitations and cold sweat and may be preceded by unexplained fatigue. Women also tend to have more severe first heart attacks which frequently lead to death as compared to men.
Stroke	<ul> <li>Sudden Confusion/altered behavior</li> <li>Weakness or Paralysis of limbs or facial muscles.</li> <li>Slurring of speech/difficulty in speech.</li> </ul>
Poisoning/Drug Overdose	<ul> <li>History of ingestion of suspected poison/chemical.</li> <li>Suspected drug over dose.</li> <li>Vomiting/stomach pain.</li> </ul>
Head Injury	<ul> <li>History of road traffic accident with loss of consciousness/vomiting.</li> <li>Bleeding from ear, nose or mouth.</li> </ul>
Fracture Bone	• Any injury resulting in severe pain, deformity or restricted movements.
Seizures/Convulsion Disorder	• Abnormal body movements, disorientation, loss of consciousness etc.

W.U.S. Health Centre provides only OPD services. No indoor facility is available. **Health Centre is equipped to provide only minor emergency services e.g.** 

- Suturing and dressing of superficial wounds
- Nebulisation and O<sub>2</sub> inhalation.
- Management of mild Diarrhea/Vomiting through I.V. Fluids.
- Inj. Tetanus Toxoid (TT) and mild pain management through injectables.
- Evacuation of patient to nearby Hospital in Ambulance.
- Physiotherapy from Monday to Friday from 9:00 AM 4:00 PM Saturday from 9:00 AM – 4:00 PM
- ECG facility from Monday to Friday from 9:00 AM 05:00 PM
- X-Ray facility from Monday to Friday from 9:00 AM 4:00 PM
- Blood/urine Tests from Monday to Friday from 9:00 Am 5:00 PM
- Medical Store from Monday to Friday from 9:00 AM 5:00 PM Saturday from 9:00 AM – 4:00 PM
- Office from Monday to Friday from 9:00 AM 5:30 PM

Therefore, any patient who needs immediate and intensive medical care should be evacuated to a nearby Hospital as early as possible without wasting critical time.
